## Excluded Absences

## EXCLUSION CRITERIA

The medical absences that can be considered for exclusion from the Attendance Program are listed below and will apply to all KHSC employees

| Surgery | Medically necessary surgery, covered by OHIP; non -cosmetic; | -Orthopaedic surgery, hysterectomy, cardiac surgery |

| Ongoing course of treatment | Where a series or sequence of similar treatments are administered over a period of time for a particular health problem. <br> "Treatment" does not include medical assessments, the collecting of a health history, communication of the assessment results or diagnosis to an individual, or a treatment plan that poses little or no risk of harm to the person. | Includes: Chemotherapy, Renal Dialysis, Blood transfusions, administration of nerve blocks for chronic pain <br> Excludes: Physiotherapy, massage therapy, allergy shots, routine immunizations, other routine medical procedures, routine visits to doctors or other health care practitioners, provision of or renewing of medication prescriptions. Visits to a healthcare practitioner for these reasons should be scheduled outside of work hours and are not an appropriate use of sick time. |
| Communicable <br> Disease- Waiting <br> Period only <br> Even where the waiting period is excluded, the absence will still be counted as an incident; <br> Where an employee is symptomatic/ill with such an iliness but does not see a doctor, the sick absence as well as any imposed waiting period will not be eligible for exclusion. | Illiness Period: the symptomatic (acute) period of a confirmed communicable disease itself will continue to count for the purpose of entry into and progressing through the Attendance Program. <br> Waiting Period: is the time period when the employee is asymptomatic (free of potentially infectious symptoms) but still considered potentially infectious for a specified time period as prescribed by KHSC infection control policies and therefore cannot return to work. <br> The waiting period is eligible for exclusion where the employee requests exclusion and all of the conditions below are met. <br> 1.the employee is under a doctor's care from the beginning of their symptoms for a confirmed communicable disease; AND <br> 2. the employee provides a note that confirms: <br> a. the visit date; <br> b. the communicable disease <br> symptoms that exist, AND <br> 3. the prescribed waiting period for exclusion from work is consistent with KHSC Infection Control policies | Tuberculosis, Chicken pox, Norovirus, Meningococcal illness, Mumps, Febrile Respiratory Illness |

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
